### 1914 Class Entertained

At the beautiful home of Mr. and Mrs. G. O. Perkins on last Friday evening, June 5th, occured an event not soon to be forgotten by those present, nor was it one of unimportance in the history of the town. It was the first annual banquet of the Arnold High School Alumni, who that night received into their association the class of 1914. This class consists of five members and doubled the strength of the association.
