



Young children (2-7 years): use simple language and be patient. use stories or play to explain things


School-age kids (7-12 years): They understand more logic and nuance, so you can be more detailed but still keep things clear.

From the Principal's Desk

Hello APS families, and WELCOME BACK!! I am very excited for this 2025-2026 school year! I hope everyone had a wonderful summer and is ready to kick the school year off again! As always, I want to thank everyone for their continued support as I roll into year three here at Arnold Public Schools. I know there have been some changes in the last two years that may seem a bit overwhelming, but I appreciate the support that is shown with each change. As life, school is ever changing, and there will continue to be changes as the years go on.

A few reminders as we get into the school year, please make sure you are checking schoology for weekly communication on upcoming events as well as any updates or changes on events and scheduling. I will post the weekly activities on Schoology and Facebook, EVERY monday. When entering the school during school hours, please be patient if there is not someone in the office when you "ring" in. The office staff will be notified when you ring the doorbell and will let you in as quickly as possible.

If there are any issues that arise during the school year, please reach out and touch base with the teachers prior to reaching out to me. The chain of command when dealing with situations should always start with the classroom/special's teacher and then if the issue is not resolved, I will then step in.

Please encourage your students to speak to their teachers if they are having any problems in the classroom or with any subjects. All teachers are here to help students and will assist them as they can. With participation in the classroom comes attendance. I want to highly encourage all parents to understand the importance of your child/children's attendance. Any time missed during school is time missed out on instructional material as well as social and emotional learning.

As we enter year three of our new SEL curriculum and universal screener, we will be administering the DESSA again this year, three times throughout the school year. I will be sending more information on that as we get closer to those dates. Mental Health is very important and although we are living in a small community, our children have struggles just as much

as anyone else living in different areas of the world. Please don't wait to talk to your children about

mental health, we have resources here at the school to help with mental health, please do not hesitate to reach out. We will be bringing back Mrs. Tami Smith as our life coach again this year. Thank you to all parents who allowed her to spend some quality time with your kiddos!

We have quite a few new staff members this year! Please welcome them with open arms and show them how great of a community they are coming to work in, really is. With new changes comes new opportunities.

We will be entering year three of our new school improvement cycle, which runs every five years. We have now created a new school improvement plan and mission statement. Our mission at Arnold Public Schools is to positively educate all students to the highest levels of academic success, to enable them to achieve personal growth and to become productive and compassionate members of society who demonstrate empathy for all. Our new school improvement goal will be focused around reading with all students Prek-12th grade showing academic growth in reading, referenced by standardized testing within the district.

I implemented a NO CELLPHONE policy back in February of this year and we are absolutely going to continue implementing this policy. ALL STUDENTS are not allowed to have their cellphone on their bodies during school hours. This includes during passing periods or at lunch. If students bring their cellphones into the school during school hours, they will be required to turn them into their designated pouches within

their homeroom classrooms. When students turn their cellphones into their homerooms, they will be allowed to pick them back up at the end of the school day, NOT during lunch or any other times throughout the day. If a student is going to be leaving school early for an activity or appointment, they are allowed to take their cellphone with them to said activity or appointment. That brings me to my next reminder. It is VERY important that students let the office and their classroom teachers know PLENTY IN ADVANCE, on days of absences. We understand that there will be times where there are last minute changes and times that students will not be able to obtain a make-up slip. However, most of the time, students

know they will be absent and still do not follow protocol on make-up work and assignments. This is for grades 7-12, that are REQUIRED to obtain a make up slip prior to leaving for an extended period of time during the school day. I am going to continue to be very strict on office hours not only with myself this year but with my staff as well. I will be encouraging the staff to shut their work life off as soon as they enter their homes and not respond to emails or phone calls (unless it is an emergency) until the following school day. I as well will not be answering phone calls or messages after 5:00pm and will return calls and emails when I get back to the school the following school day at 7:00am. Thank you for your understanding in this matter, and respecting the APS staff's personal lives. I hope everyone has a wonderful school year and I look forward to continuing to grow as Arnold Public Schools.


From the Superintendent's Desk


